



# Village Spring Cleanup Events



## Free-Cycle Weekend - April 27-29, 2018

This event is a fun, free and environmentally-friendly way to get rid of your unwanted items. Leave items in your front yard for others to pick up. Make sure it's obvious that these items are for the free-cycle event and put away items that may be taken by mistake. You can leave these items out all weekend if you wish; either to be put away by Monday or left out for the large item pick up.

## Large Item Pick Up - April 30, 2018

- Leave your large garbage items at the curbside by 7:00 am, April 30<sup>th</sup> for pick up.
- Please note that different types of items may be collected by different trucks throughout the day.
- Put a note on items (basketball/hockey nets, lawn mowers, wheel barrows, rain barrels, bicycles etc.) to help identify it as being out for pick up.
- All items must be less than six feet by three feet (1.8 metres X 0.9 metres) and weigh less than 200lbs (90 kg)
- Limit of two items per household
